



## Cub Scouting Teaches Your Son

### What happens to a Scout?

For every 100 boys who join Scouting:

- 4 will become Eagle Scouts
- 17 will become future Scout leaders
- 12 will have their first contact with a church
- 1 will enter the clergy
- 5 will earn their church award
- 18 will develop a hobby that will last through their adult life
- 8 will enter a vocation that was learned through the merit badge system
- 1 will use his Scouting skills to save his own life
- 1 will use his Scouting skills to save the life of another person



## Spending Time With Your Child: The Secret of Success!

Parents, come join the fun of Cub Scouting as a family... it's fun! You'll make new friends, too, as you work with the parents of your son's new friends. No job is too difficult when you're having fun as part of a team of Cub Scout parents, reinforcing each others' efforts to help your boys to grow up to be good citizens.

## Scouting 101

**What is a Den?** A Den is a group of six to eight boys, usually all in the same grade, within the Pack that meets several times a month between Pack meetings.

**What is a Pack?** A Pack is a group of dens that usually meet once a month at a church, school, or other community organization.

**Who is the Cubmaster?** The Cubmaster is an adult volunteer who serves as master of ceremonies at all Pack meetings and leads Pack activities of all kinds.

**Who is the Den Leader?** A Den leader is an adult volunteer who plans and runs Den meetings and activities. The Den leader also coordinates the den's involvement in Pack activities.

### Get Ready For.....

The Cub Scout pack is made up of all the dens, which meet monthly at the pack meeting, led by the Cubmaster. This is the climax of the monthly den meetings and activities. There are games, skits, songs, ceremonies, and presentations of badges that boys earned during that month. This is where families—not just parents, but siblings, too—can see the achievements of their Cub Scout. The pack, including families, also participates in other special events throughout the year, including:

**Pinewood Derby®**—Build and race a model car with your son.

**Blue and gold banquet**—Cub Scouting's birthday party—for all Pack members and their families—in February.

**Camping**—Overnight and day camp opportunities introduce your family to the camping experience. Cub Scout camping events are designed for the whole family!

**Service projects**—Packs may participate in food drives, conservation projects, or other community activities.

**Field trips and special outings**—Great ways to learn more about the people and places in your community.

**Scouting For Food**—Scouts conduct Central Florida's largest food drive.

**Scout Show**—Over 15,000 Scouts participate in the largest showcase of Scouting in Florida.

## How Much Does Scouting Cost?

**Registration Fee** - Annual fee for youth and adult leaders (The leader's fee includes a subscription to *Scouting* magazine). The amount is determined by the registration date. Tonight's registration will cover membership through December of next year.

**Boy's Life magazine:** optional, but strongly recommended.

**Pack dues** - The amount varies by Pack, depending on the success of the annual Popcorn sale and Camp Card sales. It is recommended dues be paid weekly, and be kept to no more than \$3 per week. Scouts learn a value by paying their own way.
